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City of Paisley Minutes of January 17, 2023 Regular Council Meeting

1. <u>Call to Order</u> The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on January 17, 2023, at Paisley Community Center. President Lora Mayea called the meeting to order at 5:00 p.m. Council members in attendance were Toni Bailie, Lora Mayea and Wes Houston. Others in attendance: Collette Broadfoot, Rick Wann and Jeri Wann. Councilors agreed to defer voting on any issues until the full council is present.

1. Reports

2. Public Works Water Master Travis Garner was not present. Wes Houston described the situation on January 15 when a leak in a water main became evident when a culvert was being replaced near the fire station. That water main runs under the irrigation ditch. Wes said that the water main was already leaking, possibly damaged by rocks. Travis obtained parts from the Christmas Valley Water District and repaired the main. Wes commented that the city should acquire parts to have on hand for repairs. Lora said that a notice should go out telling people that the water system is functioning again.

3. Business

- 3.1 Meeting Dates and Times Toni suggested a compromise on time of the meeting: 6:00 p.m. instead of the proposed 7:00 p.m. Lora suggested having meetings only once a month. The issue will be addressed at the next meeting. The public may request special meetings and public input at meetings is welcomed.
- **3.2** Scheduling Work Sessions Lora brought forth several items that should be addressed in work sessions that would be open to the public with notices posted three places in town and on the city web site. She has reviewed all the minutes of 2022 meetings and compiled a list of follow-up actions that could be taken:
 - *Review the employee handbook
 - 3.2.2 *Moving ICFC recycling center
 - *Respond to letters received from Jerry O'Leary after consulting with city attorney on points he addressed
 - *Obtain city attorney's opinion on Funk property line and proposals for projects on the property
 - *Review Oregon House Bill 3115 concerning city's responsibility to provide services for homeless people. There is a July 1 deadline for this action.
 - *Review the city's membership in Lake County Chamber of Commerce, are we receiving benefits from the \$600 annual dues

- 3.2.7 *Develop a list of questions for job interview for public works employee
- *Review the Water Master plan, provide copies of the plan to all councilors
- *Develop a city ordinance concerning psilocybin dispensary, perhaps distribute questionnaires to assess public opinion and obtain advice from city attorney
- 3.2.10 *Consider a city lodging tax
- *Revisit the suggestion for developing a camp ground near the rodeo arena
- 3.2.12 *Talk to the school about a crossing guard for students and a community cleanup day with student volunteers
- 3.2.13 *Follow-up on building a shed to store chemicals at treatment plant
- 3.2.14 *Order and install the sign: Bob Davis Fire Hall
