City of Paisley Minutes of September 6, 2022 Regular Council Meeting

1.0 <u>Call To Order/ Pledge of Allegiance</u> The Regular Council meeting of the City of Paisley was held on September 6 2022 at Paisley City Hall. Recorder Melissa Walton called the meeting to order at 5:01 pm. Council Members in attendance were Travis Garner, Toni Bailie, Lora Mayea and Chelsea Jones. Others in attendance: Ralph McAllister, Ross Westgate, Mike Taylor, Todd Smith, Norma Jean Carlon, Terry Carlon, and Melissa Walton, recording minutes.

Melissa told Council they needed to nominate and vote in a temporary President. All members nominated and voted for Toni Bailie, MCU. Melissa handed the meeting over to Toni.

2.0 Reports

- 2.1 <u>Public Works</u> Travis Garner stated he's continuing to work on replacing and installing stop signs and street signs. Painting lines for handicap parking, cameras, a garbage can for the park and looking into a shed for chemical storage by the treatment plant. He has a meeting with Travis Way on the sewer system.
- 2.2 Mayor Krissy joined via telephone at 5:03 pm.

3.0 Business

- Sheriff Taylor, Nuisance Officer Sheriff Taylor introduced Todd Smith, the County Code Enforcement Officer. Mr. Smith addressed Council on steps to hiring an enforcement officer of their own. He stated they would need to make a position for the person, authorizing them the authority to take civil action. The cost would be nominal; it's not full time work. He said the goal is compliance without having to issue a citation. A penalty can go to court. Once in court the judge can issue an injunction. The judge charges the county \$175 per hour and would only be needed maybe once a month. He suggested talking to the County Commissioners about including the City in their ordinance. Council asked about blocked alleys. Sheriff Taylor stated Travis, as the public works director, has the authority to load and remove the items as it's a life safety issue. And because it's a life safety issue, notice does not have to be given. He said to call for a sheriff if there are any issues and recommends running it all by legal counsel.
- 3.2 Gunnar Sigrist & Krissy Funk, Conditional Use Permit Table
- 3.3 Small City Allotment Grant Melissa stated the SCA Grant has been submitted with the help of Michelle Parry from the Town of Lakeview. The grant covers Green Street from the cattle guard to the school and Chewaucan Street from John to Mill. Travis asked about the streets in conjunction with the water system; are we going to have the streets repaired just to come along and have to tear them up again? This is something that will need to be considered.

- 3.4 Freezer Melissa stated that Krissy had wanted to ask about buying a freezer through the Mosquito Festival Fund; there was a bunch of meat donated for the festival that needs to be moved from a private home. Melissa suggested splitting the cost between the General Fund and the Mosquito Festival Fund so that those that utilize the community center, such as VIPs, and hopefully Senior Meals again one day, can also use the freezer for storage. Lora Mayea moved, Chelsea Jones 2nd, to purchase an upright freezer and share the cost between the General Fund and the Mosquito Festival Fund, MCU. Ralph McAllister offered to allow people to bbq in front of the Merc.
- 2022 RM Minutes and the August Invoices, MCU.
- 4.0 Public Appearances Ralph McAllister asked when the banners were going to come down.
 Chelsea said she would get that taken care of. He also asked if the Mosquito Festival numbers for 2022 could be posted.

Norma Jean Carlon stated there were a few people who felt the portions for the MF bbq were fairly small. She said the food was delicious just needed more of it.
